Scholar Path Program: For Students Transitioning from Columbia College to a Baccalaureate program at a Canadian University

Objective:

The Scholar Path Program provides financial assistance to students and alumni who have successfully graduated or are transferring from a program at Columbia College and have demonstrated exceptional academic performance, leadership potential, and a commitment to their chosen field of study. By offering this scholarship, we aim to encourage and support these students in continuing their education at any Canadian University, fostering their intellectual growth and enabling them to contribute meaningfully to society.

Eligibility Criteria:

The scholarship will be open to all students/alumni who have completed a minimum of 30 transfer credits at Columbia College and have been admitted into a Bachelor's program at a Canadian University. These awards will be granted in any term to undergraduate students who meet the following criteria:

- Have completed at least 30 transfer course credits at Columbia College
- Have contributed or been involved with community benefit programs, activities, or
 organizations, contributing to the well-being of their local, provincial, or national community.
- Have been in good academic standing during their time at Columbia College
- Must be seeking their first baccalaureate degree from a Canadian University
- Registered for a full course load and have been accepted or are currently enrolled into a Bachelor's program at a Canadian University. Enrollment of less than 9 credits will not be considered for the scholarship.
- Preference is for students who have graduated from the College within the last 2 years (not required)

Note: the selection of students and the number of placements is contingent on available funding

Scholarship Amount:

The scholarship amount under this program varies from \$10,000 - \$30,000, based on applicant's status in Canada (from the two categories below). This scholarship does not cover the entire cost of attendance and will only help with a portion of tuition and fees incurred by the recipient during their tenure at a university. Students are encouraged to seek other funding opportunities as well.
